Beyond the "bling bling" there is another Cannes, where Le Cannet and its Bonnard Museum stands next to the artisan's workshops of Rue Saint-Sauveur. The centuries-old alleyways recall the history of the Italian families who shaped the face of this town with authenticity. Don't look into this guide for the classic addresses that everyone's talking about. We offer a different point of view of the

region.

No matter how hot it is, we recommend walking in Cannes, where you'll always come across sights and details that make you feel you're in a seaside town with a long history. You can even walk through Napoleon's footsteps, even though it's almost impossible to mention his name today...

Walk, walk and above all, take detours!

Discovery PROMENADES



PARK OF LA CROIX DES GARDES

An untouched setting of nature, less than a kilometer from the Croisette. This park, located on the hill of the same name, watches over Cannes. A precious reserve for flora and wildlife of Provence, it offers incredible panoramas, trails, lookouts and even horses at the top! Go up to the Villa Buhler to see them. An ideal place to walk, run and dream. In winter, the hill is filled with the fragrance of 40 varieties of mimosa. Magical!

10-15 min. by car, 15 min. by bike and 45 min. by foot

IN BONNARD'S FOOTSTEPS

A 90 minutes walk to discover the painter. Starting from the Museum, discover the atmosphere, landscapes and places that inspired his paintings: gardens, turn-of-thecentury's villas and his own home-studio. You'll also discover the lovely Canal de la Siagne. Bring walking shoes, water and your strongest sunscreen. The route is available on the Bonnard Museum website.

BONNARD MUSEUM, 16 BOULEVARD SADI CARNOT - LE CANNET

SIAGNE CANAL

This 46.7 km-long canal is a source of drinkable water for Cannes and Grasse regions. It is an integral part of the natural heritage of the hinterland and the cultural identity of Provence. Numerous walks will let you enjoy its architectural and scenic beauty. For runners and walkers, there's an easy 2.8 km trail along the canal path. In a wooded environment, you'll come across the former funicular route of the Cannes observatory. The trail is dotted with watering spots. An ideal walk.



SAINTE MARGUERITE ISLAND

Take a boat to the island of Sainte Marguerite, the largest of the Lérins islands and rich in exceptional biodiversity. Take a stroll in the shade of the pines and eucalyptus that inhabit the 152 hectares of forest. Don't forget to take a mask and snorkel for a swim in the turquoise water and visit the 6 underwater statues made by the British artist Jason de Caires Taylor. The island is also famous for its historical heritage. Its Fort Royal held the Man in the Iron Mask for 11 years. The cell of this mysterious prisoner is open to visitors.

SHUTTLE DEPARTURE FROM THE PORT OF CANNES 15/20 MINUTE CROSSING

SAINT HONORAT ISLAND

A complete change of scenery on the small island of the Lérins archipelago, where calm and spirituality take place. The island has been inhabited for centuries by monks of the Abbaye de Lérins, whose days are punctuated by prayer and the production of wines, liqueurs, lavender and olive oils. Visit the abbey and take a little piece of the island home with you. The store sells all the monks' products.

15/20 MINUTE CROSSING

BOAT RIDE

Enjoy the Esterel creeks with swimming stops in a powerful, modern semi-rigid boat. A 2,5 hours trip in a protected area where its beauty will amaze you. The captain will be happy to give you information on the local flora and wildlife. Don't forget your mask and snorkel to make the most of this experience.

Coast & HINTERLANDS



SAN PEYRE PARK

An 18-hectare park in Mandelieu-la-Napoule situated on a volcanic cone. Admire the Gulf of La Napoule, the Siagne and Argentière valleys, the majestic peaks of the Mercantour and the red rocks of the Esterel. What a program!

25-30 MINUTES BY CAR VIA THE A8 FREEWAY

CAP ROUX

The summit of Cap Roux offers a 360° panorama of the Côte d'Azur. A signposted 7 km path leads to this little piece of paradise. With good walking shoes, discover this massif plunging into the Mediterranean. Red rock and turquoise water.

1 HOUR DRIVE FROM CANNES - THE WALK STARTS FROM THE SAINTE-BAUME PARKING LOT / 3 OR 4 HOURS HIKE

MOUGINS VILLAGE

The timeless citadel of the Riviera, renowned for its gastronomy and *art de vivre*. Just 20 minutes from Cannes, Mougins is a must for art lovers. Pablo Picasso spent the last decade of his life here. Cocteau, Man Ray, Lee Miller, Eluard, Picabia, Christian Dior and Edith Piaf have all fallen under the spell of Mougins, particularly the Notre Dame de Vie chapel. So why shouldn't you?

VILLAGE OF MOUGINS - 15 MIN BY CAR FROM THE MOB

CIANS GORGES

The Colorado of the Nice Alps! Sublime red gorges offering magnificent, contrasting landscapes that stretch over 1000 hectares between the communes of Guillaumes and Daluis. A wide range of supervised activities are offered all year round: geological hiking, canyoning, mountain biking, birdwatching, nocturnal observation... If you're a nature lover, you've come to the right place.

1,5 HOURS BY CAR FROM CANNES VIA THE A8 FREEWAY

SAINT PAUL DE VENCE

Another gem of the region, with its narrow streets, ramparts and old stones. The birthplace of many artworks, you can admire pieces by Miro, Chagal, Giacometti, Braque, Calder or Léger at the Fondation Maeght, which holds over 13,000 works. The many workshops and galleries, coupled with the village's unique architecture, make Saint-Paul de Vence an openair museum. Our ideal day: taste products from the market, stroll along the ramparts, lunch at La Colombe d'Or and visit the chapelle des Pénitents, decorated by Folon. Sublime.

Méditérrannée BEACHSIDE



MOURÉ ROUGE BEACH

A family-friendly sandy beach that Cannes' locals love. Located in the Pointe Croisette district, close to the Mouré Rouge harbor and sailing school. We love watching the budding sailors set sail and buying our Bagna bread from the Bono kiosk. Be sure to order in the morning for lunch. Early risers will appreciate the magnificent sunrise. Take advantage of our paddleboat rentals to discover the beauty of the coastline.

POINTE DE L'AIGUILLE CREEKS

In Théoule-sur-Mer, just past the Aiguille beach. There are two paths to choose from: the first is behind the beach restaurant, and the second starts from the parking lot on the RD 6098. Bring good shoes, as the path is steep, and plan at least 20 minutes for the walk. Stroll along the various coves and beaches, and enjoy the magical views over the Lérins Islands.

BIJOU BEACH

Located at the tip of the Croisette, this beach is accessible during the summer to people with motor, visual, hearing and mental disabilities. Ideal for toddlers, its gentle slope facilitates access to the water. A little less popular than the other beaches in the area, it is appreciated for its view of the Lérin islands. Pedal boats are available to rent, and food and drinks are available.

BIJOU BEACH, 122 BOULEVARD DE LA CROISETTE - CANNES

MACÉ BEACH

Macé beach is the largest public beach on the Croisette Ouest, located next to the private Majestic beach. In high season, consider it only if you're prepared to be close with your neighbor.

MIDI BEACH

A beach overlooking the Estérel and the beautiful Lérins islands. Families will be delighted by the playground, beach volleyball courts, shaded square, pétanque courts and other activities. Situated between the private Waikiki beach and the beaches of La Bocca, the 700-meter-long beaches are supervised all summer long. Plage du Midi has been awarded the Pavillon Bleu label, which recognizes the sustainable, environmentally-friendly management of the beach by the city of Cannes.

MIDI BEACH, BOULEVARD DU MIDI LOUISE MOREAU - CANNES

ZAMENHOF BEACH

A supervised beach managed by the municipality, with sunbeds that can be reserved online 24 hours in advance. Equipped with showers, toilets and cabins, as well as an access ramp and elevator for people with reduced mobility. The price defies all competition: \notin 9 per day and \notin 6.50 per half-day per person.

Please note that dogs are not allowed and no refunds will be given in the event of bad weather.

Private BEACHES OUR FAVORITES

LE CABANON, MOB BEACH

Our favorite beach is at La Bocca. There's no mass tourism here, just authentic Cannois lounging on deckchairs rented by the day at an affordable price (35€ with water and bath sheet and special MOB welcome). The seafront restaurant delivers a tasty, seasonal shortcourse cuisine, and sublimes local fishing and wild fishes. All orchestrated by local chef Frédéric Vacherié. From sea to plate in just a few minutes, with pasta crayfish flambéed in *pastis*, or ceviche with the catch of the day. We finish with the cabanon's famous *baba au rhum*, before taking a nap in the shade of a parasol with the gentle crash of the waves to lure us to sleep. This is our vision of paradise.

LA MÔME BEACH

The private beach located in the heart of the Croisette, in the pure French Riviera spirit, with a sandy area and a pontoon with a succession of deckchairs and daybeds. From €45 for half a day. In the kitchen, chef Stéphane Bichon offers exceptional meat and fish dishes in carpaccio, salad and tartare. Glamour, dj sets and events punctuate the summer.

COPAL BEACH

Goodbye Plage du 3.14 and hola Copal Beach! We're shifting to South American time to introduce the new private beach at 63 boulevard. The atmosphere is designed to be colorful, warm and distintcly Latin. The team is focusing on a musical program (DJ & live performances), friendly staff and a flawless menu. In the kitchen you'll find Colombian chef Juan Arbelaez, who offers a menu featuring South American specialties and Mediterranean products. The cocktail menu will surely catch your attention while you relax under your parasol. Please note that beach loungers cannot be booked : it's firts came, first served!

GOÉLAND BEACH

Located next to the Palais des Festivals, this pretty, chic private beach has been running by the same family since 1981. The Le Goéland restaurant is open all year round, serving breakfast, lunch, aperitifs, tapas and dinner. The dishes are generous and the deckchairs comfortable. Count \in 50 a day in high season and \in 30 in low season (\in 8 supplement for beach towel).

The extremely coveted address in the historic center of Le Cannet. A small restaurant run by a Japanese family with just a few tables. If you manage to make a reservation, you'll enjoy sushi, sashimi, soba and carefully prepared dishes such as teriyaki chicken, marinated octopus and donburi. A real treat.

CHOUCHOU

An intimate restaurant in the heart of the historic Saint-Sauveur alley, dedicated to gourmet pleasures and creative cuisine. Chef Stéphanie Engel plays with flavor combinations to shake up tastes and habits without denying pleasure. A menu featuring local and seasonal products that honor the homemade cuisine.

Just a stone's throw from the Musée Bonnard, this welldecorated establishment offers meaty cuisine. Meat from the finest breeds will delight fans of beef ribs and entrecotes. As for fish, you'll enjoy wild Mediterranean species paired with excellent wines.

MIMI FAKTORY



Museums TOHAVE FUN



BONNARD MUSEUM

The only museum in the world dedicated to the work of Pierre Bonnard, a major figure in 19th- and 20th-century art who spent more than twenty years in Le Cannet. It was at the Villa Bosquet that he painted his most inspired works.

In this museum, you'll admire paintings by the master in themed temporary exhibitions devoted to Bonnard alone or with other major artists of the same period: Lautrec, Gauguin, Matisse and Monet.

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WORLD EXPLORATION MUSEUM

Housed in the remains of the medieval Château of the Lérins monks in Le Suquet, this Museum boasts rich collections belonging to the city of Cannes. Among them are pieces of primitive art from the Himalayas-Tibet, the Arctic, pre-Columbian America and Oceania, as well as Mediterranean antiquities and 19th-century landscape paintings by masters in paintings of Provence called in french *les petits maîtres de la Provence*.

WORLD EXPLORATION MUSEUM, 6 RUE DE LA CASTRE - CANNES -OPEN DAILY 10AM-7PM, WEDNESDAY 10AM-9PM

UNDERWATER ECOMUSEUM

Take a mask and snorkel to discover the 6 monumental statues by artist Jason de Caires Taylor, submerged near the southern shore of Sainte-Marguerite Island. Several companies offer regular boat shuttles between Cannes and the Lérins Islands. Each of the statues has been crafted from PH-neutral ecological marine material, providing a haven for underwater life. The works will evolve over time, covering themselves in seaweed and shells. A poetic swimming.

ECOMUSÉE SOUS-MARIN, NEAR THE SOUTHERN SHORE OF SAINTE-MARGUERITE ISLAND - BAY OF CANNES

PICASSO MUSEUM

Located in the magnificent Château Grimaldi in Antibes, the Picasso Museum houses 245 works by the Andalusian master, including *La joie de vivre* and *Satyre, faune et centaure*. Other artists have found refuge in the château: paintings by Nicolas de Staël, Fernand Léger and Hans Hartung, drawings by Kostia Terechkovitch, engravings by Paul Leuquet and Claude Raimbourg, and scupltures by Joan Miró and Germaine Richier. Climb up to the Bastion Saint-Jaume to admire Jaume Plensa's monumental sculpture, *Nomade*, overlooking the Mediterranean coast. On a clear day, you can even see the south of the Alps.

INTERNATIONAL MUSEUM OF PERFUMERY

Extend your visit to Grasse, the cradle of luxury perfumery. Perfume is honored in all its aspects: raw materials, manufacturing, industry, innovation, design, marketing and uses from Antiquity to the present day. It's an opportunity to discover magnificent, precious and refined objects made from rare materials. The Museum's magnificent Gardens reveal flowers and scents from near and far.

HARTUNG BERGMAN FOUNDATION

A foundation that honors the key figures of modern art and abstraction, the couple Hans Hartung and Anna-Eva Bergman. They built their home in the hills above Antibes in the 1960s. The couple imagined a villa and studios in the heart of a 2-hectare olive grove. This "utopian house" opens its doors to the public from spring to autumn, with a temporary exhibition. Here, time is suspended, nature and light are king.




RUE SAINT-SAUVEUR

HOMAGE TO BONNARD : BIG BEN'S FRESCOES

Two murals by Lyon-based street artist Big Ben painted in 2017 to mark the 150th anniversary of Bonnard's birth. The first, on rue des Prés, depicts the painter as a young man, a spray can in hand. The second is at the entrance to the Saint-Sauveur parking lot. Inspired by an existing photo, it shows Bonnard, in the twilight of his life, sitting with his cat Poucette, and his dog Ubu. A nod to art history and the passage of time.

CHICHOURLIERS BELVEDERE


Probably the best view of the Bay of Cannes. You can see the hills of Mougins and Grasse. We love to take our bottle of dew on board and enjoy the magnificent
